Eastwood's Stires victorious in 1-5A



Last year, Eastwood High's Melanie Stires just missed reaching the high school state cross-country meet in Austin. She made it her goal to make it to state this year.


On Saturday, Stires took a big step toward that goal by winning the District 1-5A meet at the Chamizal. She won the twomile run in a time of 13:02.29, ahead of Jocelyn Caro (13:10.89) of Socorro High.

"It was a nice win; I'm just trying to stay focused and be at my best this time of the year," Stires said. "I just battled as hard as I could and tried to help us get the win as a team. Last year, I did well at regionals, but finished two spots out of a trip to state. This year I believe I can make it. I've worked hard in the weight room to get there."

Besides winning the individual title, Stires helped Eastwood win the team title with 56 points, ahead of El Dorado, Americas, Montwood, Franklin, Socorro, Hanks, Bel Air and Coronado. It was the fifthstraight district title for Eastwood.

Austin's Spencer dominates meet

In the first race of the cross-country season, Austin High School's Isaac Spencer looked like he can run forever - and then some.

senior won the The Riverside/Parkland Invitational Saturday at Veterans Park with a time of 17.01.

The next runner was 45 seconds behind.

"Last night I was thinking about it and I told myself that I wanted to win big (Saturday)," Spencer said. "I trained like crazy all summer and I just decided I was going to run like a maniac."


The fact that Spencer, seventh place at the Class 4A state meet last year, was so impressive almost took away from the fact that the Panthers finished first, second and third on their way to winning as a team.

Led by Spencer, Ramon Garcia and Anthony Castanon, Austin totaled up a low-score of 49 points, just a hair ahead of Eastwood's 50. Jefferson was third with 83 points.

"The best thing about this whole win was that Isaac looked really serious out there," Panthers' coach Truman Wills said. "I think he has kind of changed up a little this year and he is really putting running first."

A main contributor was Castanon, an approved transfer who moved into Austin's district, who Wills called "a pleasant surprise." His addition gives the Panthers a dominating 1-2-3 punch.

Vazquez took the lead early and from last year and staying up front," Vazquez said. "Now I have a partner to run up front with me (Michelle

Rutledge, second place). The plan between us was that we were going out to get in front and try to separate from everyone else."

However, the Scorpions 1-2 finish was not enough for the team win, as they placed third with 61 points. The victory went to Eastwood with 43 points, outlasting Clint's with 55.

But even in victory, Troopers' coach Mike McClain said his squad still has room to improve.

"We have some very big holes to fill. We had some graduates that were a big part of the team," Mc-Clain said. "What they did (Saturday) was out of heart."

With only three girls from last year's varsity squad, the key to this year will be hard work for the Troopers.

"As long as we run with all that we got I'll be happy," McClain added.

At the Canutillo Invitational, Socorro swept the races in every possible way. Led by individual wins by Jocelyn Caro and David Urquidi, the Bulldogs also took home team victories on the boys' and girls' sides.

Caro sprinted across the Canutillo football field and to the finish line before her nearest competitor even entered the stadium.

"... I'm really proud of myself,"
Caro said. "I was really confident when I was running."

Urquidi led a 1-2-3 finish of their own..

"I don't think we could have run a better race," Urquidi said, "We're trying to prove the rankings wrong by training hard."

79 points, well ahead of secondplace \ Montwood (134) and third-place Jefferson (162). Meanwhile, the girls beat out all 17 teams with 87 points. El Dorado was second with 125 and Horizon was third with 127.

"I was impressed with how they ran, and I know there are a lot of talented teams out there," McClain said.

Individually, Jefferson's Theresa Torres won in dramatic fashion. Although, she spent most of the final mile chasing down Eastwood's Aimee Apodaca, Torres was able to overtake her opponent with a final surge at the end to take home first place, finishing in 21:02. Apodaca finished second at 21:06 and Horizon's Sonia Vazquez was third at 21:27.

"That last mile I just kept looking up and taking it one step at a time," Torres said. "I was looking at her back and speeding up, then I would cool down a bit and then I would go again.

"I was five feet away from her and I just kept digging until I got her. After I passed her I never let go. It was my race to win."

Perhaps no one else looked as impressive on Friday as Austin's Isaac Spencer.

For the second week in a row. Spencer jumped out to a huge lead — enough to even take a couple wrong turns and still win with a time of 16:45.35.

"I liked (the race), but I went the wrong way three times, so I kind of lost my rhythm," Spencer said. "But a win's a win and coach (Truman) Wills said not to expect last week's result every time."

In the season opener, Spencer


won the Parkland/Riverside Invitational 45 seconds ahead of everyone else.

But at the Clint event, even despite a couple of wrong turns, he was still too fast for everyone and everything, even the golf cart used to lead the runners.

"It's a bad habit of mine. When I see something in front of me, I try to catch it," Spencer said. "When I saw the golf cart in front of me I went after it. I just don't like seeing things in front of me."

Jefferson's Joel Flores was second at 16:57.19, while fellow Panther Ramon Garcia was third at 17:16.81.

Eastwood boys edge out Montwood on tiebreaker

With 107 runners and 16 teams at the Coronado High School Invitational, the possibilities for a tie were small.

But not impossible.

In the boys' varsity race, No. 2 Eastwood and No. 3 Montwood both finished with the low score of 87 points to tie for first place in the cross-country meet.

According to the rules, when the score of the first five runners results in a tie, the winner is determined by the sixth run-

He did. By placing 37th, compared to Montwood's sixth runner placing 52nd, he elevated his team to victory.


"I'm glad I was able to help the team and push myself," Wallace said.

"It was a lot of different terrains and you just had to adjust," Apodaca said. "I pulled away when we started to go up the hill to the park and when we came down I just strided in."

Eastwood sweeps cross country meet titles

Juan Blanco was not supposed to win Saturday at the Eastwood/Bel Air Invitational at Vista Del Valle Park.

For most of the race Stires and Apodaca ran side by side, but in the final stretch, Del Valle's An-





gelica Palomino sprinted past Apodaca.

Runners: a different breed of athlete

There is no satisfying a cross country runner.

Either the number of miles or the amount of pain; none of it is enough for them. That is why they do what they do — run.

Cross country runners are

a different breed of athlete

altogether.

For starters, it takes a great deal of time and effort to run more miles in one hour than some drive in a day. If a three-mile race sounds tough, then you don't want to even begin to hear what these kids do in a "light" practice.

When you're outside watering your lawn or even going for a nice, easy jog, they are those teens who fly past you at full speed. You may think to that they are either just running down the street or that they might get tired and slow down soon.

Either way, you are wrong. They plan on keeping that pace for a long time.

Most of all, when they finish a workout, somewhere deep down in the back of their minds, they still feel like doing more. In fact, they know they could do more and want to.

It's not easy, but then no sport ever really is. Pain is a part of any sport, but for the runner it is unavoidable and they welcome it.

It's not about how much pain they can take and keep going, it's more about how much they want to take it.

That is why sometimes they have to be told, if not forced to understand, by





parents, trainers and coaches that even though they are used to pushing their limits, they cannot run with a concussion, the flu or a fractured leg.

It's definitely not the most popular sport, so you're not going to see a clip of a team placing all five runners in the Top 10 on "Sportscenter."

Also, a two- or three-mile course through desert, hills, parks or a school parking lot is not the easiest to keep up with, even if you try to follow in a car or dirt bike.

State champions in cross country don't garner as much attention around campus as the football team does, but once again, that doesn't matter. To them, an early Saturday morning race in the freezing rain or in the sizzling sun is as marquee an event as a Friday night football game under stadium lights.

Several of their fellow students may only know them as, "Hey, you're that kid who is always running when I'm leaving school.'

Most importantly for these athletes, cross country isn't just a sport, it's the sport for them.

It has the ability to take atural runners and give m a challenge, while at same time giving others more determination talent a chance to inally prove themselves.

They don't need a crowd, band or cheerleaders. Motivation can come in the form of loved ones, friendship, a favorite song or phrase while they navigate a course.

At the end of the day, or at the end of a career, the cross country runner still is not done. Inside of them there is one more great mile just waiting to get out. No matter what they do, it will always be there, because it never is enough.

Eastwood grad will jump at nationals

EL PASO — Baylor's Jessica Ubanyionwu arrived at last weekend's pre-national meet in Austin a bit adrift.

A sensational start to her sophomore indoor season was gone, replaced with struggles as the Eastwood High School graduate fought herself in the triple jump through the outdoor season.

By the time she got to Austin's Michael Myers Stadium, though, Ubanyionwu finally figured out what was wrong.


"I was thinking a lot, and it's not good to think," she said. "In my outdoors, there was a big gap from what I had been jumping indoors.

"I needed to stop thinking and just jump. I started my approach faster so I wouldn't think."

In one jump, all her struggles were undone. On her first attempt in Austin, she soared 42 feet, 11½ inches, an improvement by more than a foot and a half over anything she had done since indoors and punched a ticket to the NCAA track and field championships in the process.


"I just concentrated on jumping big and I stopped thinking about angles and things like that," Ubanyionwu said. "Oooh, I was so excited. I thought, 'Oh my gosh, I might make it to nationals.'"

That was the only jump she needed at the pre-national meet, but importantly, she had two more solid jumps behind it any-
























However, things are different at Eastwood High School, which barely made the cut to remain a Class 5A school during UIL re-alignment earlier this month.

"In the summer, they are doing basketball and volleyball at the same time," Eastwood girls basketball head coach Endi Vargas said. "Then when the school year begins, we don't see them until volleyball is over."

However, the sharing is not something Vargas frowns upon.

"Some of my best players have been my multi-sport athletes," she said. "I have a real good relationship with other coaches. So when basketball is over, I send a lot of my girls to track and softball."

But in the case of sports that bridge semesters, such as swimming, tennis and golf, the balance nearly is impossible because competitions will be on the same day. Even in soccer, it is easier said than done to double-dip.

Vargas remembers the duo Jami and Toni Tullius, twins who were stars in basketball and soccer. Because the soccer and basketball seasons overlap, it was difficult to share the girls.

"When they went on a big out-oftown tournament, I would let them go," Vargas said. "I knew they would get bigger exposure there."

The twins eventually went on to play soccer in college. However, when the basketball playoffs began, it was the middle of the soccer season, making it impossible for the

girls to leave the gym.



Eastwood runner stays the course

Mike Pivarnick is a throwback. a ream-oriented athlete who can make a one-handed catch of a football, nail a 3-point shot, even run you down in the mile.

He played football his freshman year at Eastwood, and if it weren't for Mike McLain, people could be reading about Mike Pivarnick the wide receiver.

But as it turned out, the junior was persuaded to run cross country. It wasn't a bad choice. Actually, he's the best in El Paso.

"Coach McLain would pull me out of class, quite frequently, my freshman year and tried to get me to run cross country. It was a nui-sance, but after a while I realized that he had a lot of confidence in me. To see that was amazing, I said I'd give it a shot, and it sur-prised me that he was right."

Two years later, Pivarnick will be participating in his second regional cross country meet this Saturday in Lubbock and looking to make his first trip to the Class 5A state championships.

Since then, Pivarnick has begun his own collection of medals. He has a silver from the 2003 district championships and hopes to add a bigger one this weekend by improving on last year's 17th-place regional finish.

"He's a competitor. He's going to get in that race, and he's going to get after it, which will give him a very good shot," McLain said.

Pivarnick certainly has that shot - an opportunity to make even more runners wish he'd have stayed on the football field; not listened to his persuasive coach; kept well clear of their sport of choice.
